

Bake Sale to Benefit the Summer Reading Program

The 2008 summer reading program at the Campbellsport Public Library was a great success. The Library encouraged 290 area children between the ages of 3 and 12 to read during the summer months. We also enticed 48 teens to keep reading during their vacation. These kids collectively read approximately 867,520 minutes over a seven week period.

We also encouraged families and children to spend some time at the Library by hosting programs in June and July. The 14 planned events attracted 991 people.

The theme for 2009 summer reading program is *Be Creative @ Your Library*. Preparations are already underway to make next summer's programming exciting for children of all ages .

The summer reading activities, special performers and reading incentives are all paid for by donations from local business, individual library supporters and through the Library's election day bake sales.

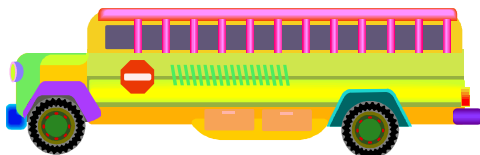
