Our book sale storage room is starting to burst at the seams so we will be holding a small sale upstairs in the Library during regular operating hours starting December 3rd and running daily through December 12th. There will be an assortment of books and magazines to look through for readers of all ages, skill levels, and interests. New books will be added to the selection each day of the sale. Prices remain low, with hardcover adult books selling for \$1 and paperback and children's books selling for .50¢ and magazines sell for 5/\$1.

The Library accepts donations of books, movies, CDs, and puzzles anytime we are open throughout the year.

### FREE ACTIVITIES FOR CHILDREN IN DECEMBER

#### Letters to Santa

Mr. Claus has asked the Library to help him collect your letters again this year. Remember to tell him how good you have been this year and all about the presents you want. Make sure to include your name and address on your letter so he is sure to find your mailbox. Letters should be placed in the special mailbox at the Library. We are collecting letters starting Nov 26th. Please make sure to get your letter to the Library by Tuesday, Dec 18th so Santa Claus gets your request on time.

#### Christmas Craft Cart Activities

Kids of all ages are invited to stop by the Library anytime we are open beginning Saturday, December 1st through Saturday the 22nd to make a holiday themed craft. A new craft project will be available each week and all supplies will be provided for free.

#### Story Hour

Wednesdays at 10:30 am

Preschoolers are invited to drop-in on any Wednesday morning at 10:30 for stories, games, science experiments, crafts, and sometimes even a snack. This is a great opportunity for children to interact with other children and for parents to meet other parents of young children. This is a free event.

#### Tales to Tails

Tuesday, December 18th

Register your reader for a 15 minute read aloud session with one of two licensed READ therapy dogs. Reading out loud to the therapy dog helps children build reading confidence and a love of reading.
