

Campbellsport Public Library's 2010 Year in Review

The Library owns a total of 37,836 items. This includes books, movies, CDs and magazines in a variety of genres for people of all ages. This is a small portion of the over one million items that are readily available for loan through the Winnefox Library System. In 2010, our 3078, library users borrowed 53,741 of these items.

The Library's other resources were heavily used also. The public computers stations were accessed 7,603 times. This doesn't include the numerous times that the wireless internet signal was used.

The programs that the Library hosted throughout the year were well attended. The adult programs attracted a total of 385 participants and the children's programs were attended by 2151 children.

Rebecca is an ageless, timeless movie about a woman who marries a widower but fears she lives in the shadow of her predecessor. This was Hitchcock's first American feature, and it garnered the Best Picture statue at the 1941 Academy Awards. In today's films, most twists and surprises are ridiculous or just gratuitous, so it is sobering to look back on this film where every revelation not only shocks, but makes organic sense with the story line. Laurence Olivier is dashing and weak, fierce and cowed. Joan Fontaine is strong yet submissive, defiant yet accommodating. There isn't a false moment or misstep during the entire film.

Rochelle Pennington and her son, Nicholas have traveled abroad to research Sir Ernest Shackleton's famous 1914 expedition to the south pole and the crews astonishing determination to survive being stranded in a hostile environment for almost two years.

The unwavering leadership skills that Sir Shackleton demonstrated throughout the sailors' entrapment lead to the this expedition earning the title of "greatest survival story in human history". Even today, Shackleton's methods of leadership are studied, taught and used by major universities and corporations. Rochelle and Nicholas Pennington document this remarkable journey through words and historical photographs in their book entitled *The Endurance; Histories Greatest Ship Wreck*.

Ms. Pennington, a very popular public speaker, will be at the Library to enlighten listeners about this Arctic expedition and the people who fought to survive the voyage.

After the presentation there will be time for audience members to ask questions about the presentation and also about the author's other books, her newspaper columns, her speaking engagements and her career as a self published author and professional speaker.

The author will be selling and autographing books at the end of the program.
