New material is added to the Library's collection on a daily basis. Among countless things, our collection includes best selling novels for adults, young adults and school aged readers. We offer a large selection of classic and new children's picture books. The emerging reader collection has fiction and non-fiction books that are guaranteed to interest every new reader. Our non-fiction collection boasts books about crafts and hobbies, cookbooks, autobiographies or biographies, self help works, classic novels, poetry and political volumes.

The Library subscribes to a variety of magazines. The latest copies are kept at the Library for patron browsing but older issues are available to check-out.

Our audio visual collection contains music CDs in a variety of genres for children and adults. Our movie collection encompasses blockbuster releases, award winning films, television series, documentaries and children's movies, to name a few.

All of this material is carefully selected. First and foremost patron needs and wishes are considered. The current col-

lection is reviewed to see to it that the most heavily used items are supplemented by new material. Professional and amateur reviews are considered when purchasing all the material. And of course, purchases are somewhat limited by the yearly budget.

We openly welcome requests to purchase specific titles at anytime. A form to submit a request is located at the circulation counter at the Library and also on our website. Feel free to talk directly to a staff member about requests while you are in the Library.
