In order to give these kids enough materials to work with so their imaginations can run wild, we are asking our neighbors to donate some of these materials in order to make the summer reading programs a success. Many of the items we are asking you to donate are things you would normally throw away or recycle. Please look through our wish list and think of the Campbellsport Public Library's Summer Reading Program before you throw an item away or when you are walking down the aisle of a store and notice a great sale on office supplies. We thank you in advance for your much appreciated donations.

We are looking for donations of recycled material such as plastic milk caps, toilet and paper towel rolls, paper and plastic grocery bags, cardboard from cereal boxes, extra large cardboard boxes, and scraps of wallpaper.
