Donations Towards the Summer Reading Program

Each year the Summer Reading Program is funded totally through donations. Many local businesses generously donate money for programming supplies or for prizes to hand out to the participants. The funds that we earn from the Election Day Bake Sale are also used to fund this program. The Library earned \$300 from the April sale, thank you to all that baked and bought.

Typically over 250 children sign up to participate in the programs so we can always use more supplies and prizes. We will accept money but also small prizes such as books, stuffed animals, small board games, playing cards, balls, squirt guns and coloring books are always popular. The teens and adults love to receive gift certificates or coupons for free activities.

We can also use donations of craft supplies such as crayons, markers, colored paper, glue, glitter glue, sea shells, blue crepe paper, paper plates, googly eyes and wide mouth glass jars.

This project needs to be done by someone who is proficient with Microsoft Publisher and has a good sense of design. This project can be worked on at any time.

Labeling Popular Books in a Series

This project will be time consuming but it can be worked on at anytime.

Organization of the Adult Non-fiction Collection

This project will be time consuming but it can be worked on at anytime. Training will be provided.
