

Summer Happenings at the Campbellsport Public Library

Once again the annual summer reading program at the Library was a success. This year's theme was water. For six weeks we invited kids to come to the Library to learn about water and the things that are connected to it. These programs attracted a total of 712 participants.

We also encouraged people of all ages to read over the summer. Our adult readers added 40 - 60 entry forms into the drawing each week, 182 kids between the ages of 3 and 12 signed up to read for tickets which they exchanged for prizes and 28 teens took a weekly chance to win a prize bag.

This program was funded entirely

With the gracious help of volunteers we were able to finish some other extra projects. Our biggest project was labeling all of the books that are written as part of a series. This was done so readers will have an easier time finding what to read next. Other library material was organized and cleaned up throughout the summer months.

Painting the interior of the Library is still a work in progress. The upstairs has been completed and the colors look great. The lower level walls are getting a coat of a warm grey color. This area should be completed within the next two months. The Library does have two other small painting projects that need attention.
