Donated and fundraised funds support many of the Library's important services. Almost all of the DVDs, CDs and recorded books that are available for patrons to borrow are purchased with this money. The programming the Library provides for all age groups is also supported with these funds. The Summer Reading program, which without fail encourages over 250 of the area's children to keep learning each summer, is entirely funded by donations. In order to maintain our current level of service to the community, we need your help raising money to replenish our gift fund.

The Library is holding a bake sale on Tuesday, April 2nd during the election.

We are asking library supporters to donate homemade baked goods wrapped and ready to sell on Monday, April 1st between 9 am and 8 pm or early on Tuesday. Volunteers will price the bakery.

We will be collecting loose change to help support the Summer Reading program. Please clean out the loose change in your pockets or at the bottom of your purse and deposit it in the container on the circulation counter.

The Library is sponsoring a fun and artistic fundraiser. We are asking community members to donate any old, unwanted wooden chairs. They may be dropped off at the Library between now and June 1st. Small tables, benches, or wooden shelves and crates will also be accepted. Starting in June, anyone interested in participating in the fundraiser may stop in and select a chair of their liking to hand paint in any way you choose. The different themes that can be depicted on the pieces of furniture are endless. We have some samples at the Library to spark your imagination. Directions about how to prepare the chair for painting and what types of paints to use will be available when the person gets their chair. We are asking that the artists return the decorated chairs back to the Library by September 1st. They will remain on display for two weeks so people have a chance to view the works of art and place bids in a silent auction.
